

### SECURITY COUNCIL

"We engaged in profound discussions on key historical and legal matters, including the breakup of Yugoslavia, post-separation racial discrimination, and the atrocities of the Bosnian War. A critical distinction was made between genocide and ethnic cleansing, while judges meticulously examined evidence, questioning advocates on the timeline of the conflict and the actions of the Army of Sprska. Beyond our case, delegates also tackled pressing global issues, from protecting women and girls from sexual violence in conflict zones to combating transnational organized crime in Latin America and the Caribbean. The energy was unmatched, with strong lobbying, passionate debates, and unwavering dedication."



INTERNATIONAL COURT OF JUSTICE (ICJ)

"In the ICJ, we had the opportunity to discuss the history of Yugoslavia and its dissolution into independent states, as well as the racial discrimination that followed its breakup. A significant focus was placed on the atrocities committed during the Bosnian War, alongside an analysis of the legal distinction between genocide and ethnic cleansing. Judges carefully examined evidence presented by both parties, questioning advocates on the timeline of the Bosniak War, the alleged occurrence of genocide, and the atrocities committed by the Army of Republika Srpska. These discussions provided a conflict's deeper understanding of the complexities and the legal arguments surrounding it."
